

#### Pastoral Care Day: Listening To the Needs



In September Mothers' Union hosted an introduction to best practice in undertaking pastoral care in our branches/ dioceses in the Church of Ireland Theological Institute with Revd Canon Dr. Daniel Nuzum and Revd Bruce Pierce.

Six aspects were considered during the day:

- 1. Living with Loss
- 2. Guidelines on best practice during a pastoral visit
- 3. Basic tips for listening well
- 4. Pastoral Care in Perinatal Bereavement
- 5. Pastoral Care and Dementia
- 6. Safeguarding

Participants were very enthused by the day and found it helpful, thought provoking, enjoyable and informative. We are a caring Christian organisation and days like this, bring us forward on our ministry journey towards nurturing and supporting family life around our dioceses. Each diocese will now discuss future developments in this area. #### Mums in May 2018: DR Congo Project



Mothers' Union in Ireland hold a triennial fundraiser across the country – Mums in May. 2018 marked the third such event with members in branches all over Ireland raising funds for our work both at home and overseas.

The overseas project selected for Mums in May 2018 is the support of our members in DR Congo as they campaign against gender-based violence. In one instance, MU in DR Congo campaigned successfully for prisoners to be housed separately. Men, women and children had been held in one compound

leaving the women and children open to abuse. Working with other agencies, MU members secured separate housing for the women and children. Funding from MU in Ireland will enable further campaigning and practical work to continue and develop.

(Located in central Africa, the Democratic Republic of Congo spreads over a territory the size of Western Europe and borders 10 countries. Since gaining its independence in 1960, the country has been marred with trouble, unrest and corruption culminating in a civil war. Tensions remain high in many areas and civil unrest is still rife in the north-eastern area of the country. Against this challenging backdrop, Mothers' Union members are incredibly active within their local communities providing a lifeline for many families through both practical and pastoral support. There are more than 30,000 members of Mothers' Union in DRC acting as beacons of hope in communities facing immense pressures and difficulties.)
