#### **Christmas Traditions and Their Origins**

- The celebration of Christmas started in Rome about 336, but it did not become a major Christian festival until the 9th century.
- Nativity scenes first appeared in 10th-century Rome.
- The practice of putting up special decorations at Christmas began during the 15th century, when it was recorded that in London that every home be 'decked with holm, ivy, bays, and whatsoever the season of the year afforded to be green.'
- German Lutherans introduced the first Christmas tree in the Cathedral of Strassburg, in 1539.
- Since the 16th century, the poinsettia, a native plant from Mexico, has been associated with Christmas
  carrying the Christian symbolism of the Star of Bethlehem. In Mexico it is known as the 'Flower of the Holy
  Night.'
- Towards the end of the 18th century the practice of giving gifts to family members became well established.
- The first commercially produced decorations were created in Germany in the 1860s, inspired by the paper chains made by children.
